- Is respectful toward teachers, administrators, coaches, and other caregivers in the St. Brigid community and the community at large.

- Is present and involved in the St. Brigid community through volunteer opportunities such as the Home and School Association service projects, special events, and special committees, when able.

St. Brigid encourages and invites parents to foster their own religious life alongside their student. By nurturing their own spirituality, parents can best guide their student in his or her relationship with God.
